Ms. Torres notified the Committee that Ms. Driver will no longer be able to attend meetings in person on the second Friday of the month but could attend a different day. When asked if they wanted to change the meeting day, most members agreed Friday is best for them and said they will pursue a virtual option for Ms. Driver.

  - **6c. 2024 Annual Report:** Review of the 2024 Annual Report for the TCSHC.

Ms. Torres briefly summarized highlights from the 2024 Annual Report, which included reorganizing the Committee and forming subcommittees to focus on funding and public, partner and youth outreach. Ms. Torres also highlighted the Committee's inaugural community event, the Indian River Lagoon Science Festival, where Committee members operated an educational booth and invited people to paint seashells and approximately 200 people visited the booth. Chairwoman Gregory commended the Committee for meeting its goals for the year.

**6e.** TCSHC Presentation for the Indian River Lagoon Symposium (IRLS): Review of the IRLS presentation.

Ms. Torres provided a brief presentation for the upcoming IRLS, showcasing the goals, objectives and strategies of the TCSHC. Chairwoman Gregory asked if she could include a residential photo along Indian River Drive could be included, noting that the Committee is concerned with preserving the existing neighborhoods along with natural resources. Ms. Price noted that the lower speed limit of 25 miles per hour imposed recently seems to have slowed traffic compared to the earlier speed limit of 35 miles per hour. Ms. Arpayoglou suggested

showing the road and adjacent waterway to emphasize the proximity between the two.

#### 7. <u>Discussion Items</u>

**7a. Highlights from the Indian River Lagoon (IRL) Science Festival:** Summary of the TCSHC participation at the IRL Science Festival.

Ms. Torres noted she and TCSHC member Steven Haines attended the IRL Science Festival on October 26th at Veterans Memorial Park in Fort Pierce and interacted with about 200 adults and children. Ms. Torres presented several photos of the Committee's booth and shell-painting activity. Chairwoman Gregory praised the turnout and community interaction.

**7b. Subcommittee Updates:** Review of meeting summaries and major items from Subcommittee Meetings.

Ms. Torres updated members of two Subcommittees that have met since the last regular TCSHC meeting. The Funding Subcommittee discussed seeking federal nonprofit status and discussed grant opportunities for 2025, while the Public Outreach Subcommittee drafted goals to obtain more partner events and produce the first TCSHC newsletter this year. The remaining two Subcommittees were unable to meet but plan to do so before the next regular TCSHC meeting.

Ms. Price noted she will be attending several Earth Day events in April and said she will distribute TCSHC materials at the events. She further noted flyers with QR codes linking to the Committee's website or social media accounts would be helpful. Ms. Price also offered to introduce Ms. Torres to Greg Enns, publisher of "Indian River Magazine," to generate more publicity for the group's events and mission.

Ms. Arpayoglou identified that this is the 50-year anniversary of the Aquatic Preserve Act that created her Division in FDEP and suggested the TCSHC work to include a kiosk and signage at the new observation tower being built at Walton Scrub on Indian River Drive. The St. Lucie

County Environmental Resource Division that is installing the tower will make a presentation to the Committee, she also indicated, prompting Chairwoman Gregory to note that lack of parking is an issue at the nature preserve and elsewhere on Indian River Drive.

**7c. Florida Scenic Highways Program (FSHP) Update:** An update of FSHP activities.

Ms. Torres explained that Mike Palozzi of FDOT provided dozens of FSHP wall calendars to the Committee and informed members of the upcoming annual meeting in Apalachicola February 25-27. He reiterated that FDOT is available for any printing needs the TCSHC has, and Ms. Torres suggested asking FDOT to print a kiosk sign rather than brochures since the Committee already has brochures. She reminded members that Florida Crossroads may be coming to photograph local scenic byways and interview stakeholders as part of its statewide focus on such roadways.

8. Recommendations/Comments by Members – Ms. Price remarked that FDOT is a huge asset and suggested the TCSHC take advantage of everything the state agency offers. Chairwoman Gregory asked if there are any constraints from local governments if the group were to pursue 501c3 nonprofit status, and Ms. Torres offered to research the matter. Chairwoman Gregory said she has reviewed the requirements for nonprofit status and said while most tasks can be competed online, there are small fees associated with becoming a nonprofit organization.

The members then discussed the costs to establish a nonprofit, solicitation of public funds, potential grants, and sponsorships and agreed to continue discussions on the topic.

- **9. Staff Comments** Ms. Torres identified the Committee vacancies for resident members from unincorporated North and South Hutchinson Islands and indicated alternates are needed for several positions.
- **10. Next Meeting:** The next meeting of the TCSHC will be a regular meeting scheduled for 10:00 am on Friday, May 9, 2025.

Chairwoman Gregory asked if Ms. Torres would send the bylaws to each member to review for possible solutions to members who can't attend meetings in person. She suggested a virtual option be made available.

Ms. Price asked if Ms. Torres could inform her which subcommittees need members so she can select one or more to join.

#### **BACKGROUND**

To support the TCSHC 2025 Work Plan goals of expanding the partnership network of the committee and of supporting partner projects along the Scenic Highway, the St. Lucie County Environmental Resources Department (ERD) was invited to provide a presentation on one of its latest initiatives along the Treasure Coast Scenic Highway, a new observation tower at Walton Scrub Preserve located off Indian River Drive.

#### **ANALYSIS**

The St. Lucie County ERD will showcase its new observation tower project constructed off Indian River Drive at the Walton Scrub Preserve. The tower is over 50 feet tall and will facilitate beautiful views of the lagoon and ocean. This project is designed to enhance public access to natural resources, promote environmental education, and offer unique recreational opportunities along the corridor. The observation tower will serve as a destination point, drawing both residents and visitors to experience the area's natural beauty from an environmental perspective. Future plans for Walton Scrub will include construction of an outdoor pavilion and restroom facility as well as a boardwalk and fishing pier on the lagoon for visitors to enjoy.

Highlighting this project provides an opportunity to explore how the committee can support and amplify initiatives led by its partners. It also reinforces the committee's Work Plan objective of championing projects that increase awareness, appreciation, and access to the corridor's scenic, cultural and ecological assets.





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

The 2025 Work Plan includes the following items that need to be revisited:

- Grant Opportunities The TCSHC has not yet explored grant funding opportunities due to the lack of formal nonprofit or 501c(3) tax-exempt status. This limitation presents significant challenges, as many grant opportunities, especially those at the state and federal levels, require applicants to be eligible for funding. Without this designation, the Committee is unable to apply directly for a wide range of public and private grants that could otherwise support enhancements, programming, and promotional efforts along the Scenic Highway.
   Needed Action: Explore alternative strategies.
- Youth Outreach & Engagement Kick-Off The TCSHC has not yet established a Youth Outreach Strategy due to the absence of a formal framework to support youth involvement. Needed Action: Committee should look to establish partnership with existing student-led volunteer groups such as Key Clubs or environmental clubs.

#### **BACKGROUND**

A key focus of the TCSHC 2025 Annual Work Plan is to strengthen community partnerships and expand youth engagement activities for the committee. Engaging young people in meaningful, place-based service opportunities helps cultivate a new generation of environmental stewards and community leaders. Youth participation in Scenic Highway projects not only fosters a personal connection to the environment but also encourages long-term civic responsibility and leadership development.

#### **ANALYSIS**

To support youth participation in Scenic Highway volunteer activities, collaboration with local school volunteer organizations (Key Clubs and other student-led service organizations) should be explored. Partnering alongside these established groups ensures a structured approach to youth involvement and provides a built-in network of motivated volunteers. Additionally, working with club sponsors or faculty advisors allows schools to designate chaperones or authorized adult representatives who can oversee student participation during events. This approach not only ensures proper supervision and safety but also strengthens school-community partnerships and encourages continued engagement through recognized service hours and leadership development opportunities.

Building on these partnerships, engaging youth through service-oriented events like clean-ups not only fosters a sense of responsibility and connection to the local environment but also builds early awareness of the Scenic Highway's value, laying the groundwork for sustained community involvement and future leadership. Through collaboration with partners such as the Smithsonian Marine Eco-Systems Exhibit at South Causeway Park, beach or park clean-up events can provide meaningful, hands-on experiences that combine environmental education with civic engagement, making a lasting impact on both participants and the Scenic Highway Corridor.

The 2026 Annual Work Plan is attached which incorporates activities and goals that will assist the committee with reorganization efforts, community engagement, and education efforts to educate the community on the Treasure Coast Scenic Highway. The 2026 Work Plan consists of 9 major activities that correlate with the 5 goals of the Treasure Coast Scenic Highway Committee.

The major activities of the 2026 work plan include:

• Expand Social Media Storytelling & Visual Content: Highlight compelling stories, photos, and videos from travelers, community members, and local businesses.

- Participation in community engagement efforts educating the community on the byway and FSHP: Inform residents, business, tourists, and local governments about how the scenic highway can benefit the community in terms of economic, environmental, social, and cultural aspects.
- Meet FSHP reporting requirements for Annual Report and Work Plan submissions: The committee will submit two reports annually to comply with the Florida Scenic Highway Program requirements. An Annual Work Plan is due by November 15th that outlines the goals, strategies, and actions for the upcoming year. An Annual Report is due annually by February 1st that summarizes the TCSHC's achievements, challenges, and impacts for the previous year.
- Corridor Management Plan Update: Update the Treasure Coast Scenic Highway Corridor Management Plan (CMP) in alignment with Florida Scenic Highway Program requirements. The update will ensure compliance with program standards, reflect current conditions and priorities, and integrate community and stakeholder input.
- Submit Florida Scenic Highway Gary Balough Award Nomination:
   Prepare and submit a nomination for the FSHP Gary Balough Award to recognize the Treasure Coast Scenic Highway's achievements, highlighting key projects, community impact, and corridor enhancements.
- Support partner projects that are consistent with the TCSHC's vision: Collaborate with local organizations, agencies and community groups to identify, support and promote projects that contribute to the overall goals of the TCSHC and FSHP.
- Develop and expand distribution of the Treasure Coast Scenic Highway Newsletter: Broaden the reach of the TCSH newsletter by connecting with new partners and leveraging digital channels to reach more readers.
- Support FSHP efforts to educate the community on the value of a designated byway: Because engaging the community can foster a sense of ownership and stewardship, the TCSHC will participate in, and support events initiated by the FDOT D4 Scenic Highway Program.

• Coordinate Youth Engagement Activities with Local Partners:

Because the TCSHC aims to foster youth involvement and awareness in
the preservation of the scenic highway, the committee will co-organize
youth engagement activities with local partners. The activities will be
aimed at engaging local youth to participate in community service
activities along the Treasure Coast Scenic Highway, aiming to inspire a
sense of stewardship and community involvement.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Because the 2026 Annual Work Plan meets the requirements of the Florida Scenic Highway Program and will assist the TCSHC by providing goals and activities for the 2026 calendar year, it is recommended that the Treasure Coast Scenic Highway Committee review and adopt the 2026 Annual Work Plan.
